Ann, Rosenberg called to day and is writing a letter to you - she inquired about all of us and sends her regards. Mr. Pinus is still in the hospital and I'll call Mrs. Pinus again to-night. Helma, Joel and my Mom spent part of the afternoon with me and they're all O.K. This is a shorty as I'm getting baby ready for sleep and may go shopping to night with Betty.
