

Tuesday eve -
Dec. 11th 1944.

George dearest,

How can I ever describe in letters my love for you, how much I want you and need you now as always. The time will come real soon when the three of us will be re-united and what a great day that's going to be in my life. In the meantime, I, too, am trying to be a good mother and also a patient mother. The little blonde rascal tries my patience lately but I guess it's one of those stages and will pass quickly. Only last night he awakened out of his sleep - it was 11 P.M. - and he was up until almost 1:45 A.M. - saying "Daddie" and plenty of baby talk. It may have been too warm in the room resulting in that he was very restless. The weather did change for the better and it was grand out to day.

After mailing your letter, I awaited

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some of your letters and read a few more.
Eleanor's letter of Dec. 5 made me laugh
so much that I re-read it again. Her
sense of humor is great and you're not a
silly - - Er. For other amusements, I listened to
"The Constant Nymph" and "Watch on the Rhine".
Both were excellent as they have been
every Monday night for the past few weeks.

This morning I was so elated to get
three letters from you darling (Fri. Sat. Sun)
and I have received a daily letter up to
now - sometimes 3 and 4 at a time but not
^{always in} chronological order. The day I don't get
news sometimes seems like a week therefore my
past complaint. Air mail letters arrive in 3 and
2 days and reg. mail in 3 to 4 days (Dec.) Now
the service is a bit better.

To-day was a very full day. Jimmie
and I were out early, baby napped out -

doors, and after lunch I picked up Sonny and Lowell and drove to the city. Finally I got a few of those gifts which I've had on my mind for these many months. For Sonny I bought a fine red leather frame size 8" x 10". He called to night and I told him about it - he also sends his best to you. For Betty (Loren) Perlman I bought a crystal fruit bowl trimmed with sterling silver inlaid (\$3.00) (2.65). For Mr. Prince's son I bought a candy dish (1.75) - these are all strictly wholesale and sell for double - honest. The day was well spent, Jimmie behaved nicely but insists on putting the lights on in the car. We returned home before 6 had our respective suppers and Jimmie was asleep by 7 p.m.

Just had a long talk with Min Lieber

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about every thing in general and she sends her
love to you. All's well at the Lickers. Sonny
is "blossoming" and may move into a private
house.

Your folks are well, I spoke to Mom this
eve and told her that you're O.K. too. They
sent the sweaters and some goodies to you yesterday.
If you think that pillow case is not too "cheesy"
you may send it at any time. I got another roll
of films and will send more snaps when they're
developed. Enclosed find \$2.00

That ride on the Mississippi sounds romantic
and I hope you had a swell time if you did
make the trip. In the meantime keep well,
my dearest husband and I'll write again
to-morrow.

all my love and devotion to you. Jimmie
sends a great big hug and kiss to you.
