When I bathe him I really have dirt to wash off and he squeals with joy at each bathing time. He's all sugar and honey as far as sweeteners goes and he rarely has a cranky day.

It's raining to-night and I expect your father to ^{be} have some with all the bills, etc. for that income tax return. Mom is home & preparing supper. I suggested that they eat here but Mom already shipped this morn. Eleanor spoke with me before supper and all is well on the home front. Her best regards to you. Sonny also called and his family is O. K. She is getting a bottle of "Album Percomaphan" for baby and I'll pick it up next week. No mail from you to-day but I got a letter for you from a Mrs. Kellman with ^{\$}210.00 check enclosed. It is made out to the Widows and Orphans Fund and the letter starts off with "Dear Mr. Shroyer." I've already forwarded same to Billy Rabel and he'll take care of it.

Every week and I manage to have chicken for at least 2 days and I shop in the Midwood around the corner.

To-day is the 17th, 3 months since you're gone away and it does seem longer than that time. I guess that love, though not as hot quite dead and lonely boy how I miss you. With the Spring coming on real soon, a good dose of sulphur and molasses will probably cure me of any Spring fever I may get. Physically I feel fine now and hope I stay that way for a long time.

Yarr-Toff just came in so I'll continue to-morrow with my daily news.
