

Philadelphia 25th September 1779

Sir,

I have the honor of transmitting to you
herewith enclosed, a copy of an Act of Congress of the 24th Inst,
providing for the Settlement of all disputes between
the States of New-Hampshire, Massachusetts-Bay
and New York relative to their Boundaries, & between
those States, and the People of the district called the
New-Hampshire-Grants who claim to be a separate
Jurisdiction. Congress are so sensibly impressed
with the Importance of these objects that this Act
passed Unanimously, and they flatter themselves
that the same Sentiments will influence the States
in question to adopt without delay the measures
it recommends. -
