My source is so limited but also comes from a loyal but aching heart. We are ~~inseparable~~ ^{inseparable} for each other and maybe the Fates will soon fix that matter, I hope. Love you as much as always. Always, darling, and my chin is up again.

After mailing your letter last night, Winnie spent some time with me and I did turn in early after she left. Baby is coming along fine - he's had two good days and I don't feed him too much. It seems that his vomiting drove my appetite away and I'll be fine again by to-morrow. He understands most everything I say to him but still has his limited vocabulary.

(Monday's)
With your very sweet letter this morning I received
a dividend check from Allied States for \$6.25 and some
circulars. I'll deposit the check this week. Helma got me
a frame for Jimmie's picture which I'm giving to your folks.
She and Joel were on the way to the P.O. to-day and I was going
to Sonny Shewin where I spent the afternoon. The baby
sleeps so nicely when I visit but he just wouldn't urinate
on a strange seat. That's inherited, isn't it, Daddy. The
Shewins are all well and Sonny is in his 7 month. His sister
is a nurse in England and in to-days letter to Sonny hinted that
she was being moved to the front as they expect ^(allies) to start ~~an~~ invasion
any day. That's good news.

All the folks are O.K. and Mom and Pop are still
bearing up bravely. The weather is still mild and that
means baby and I are out most of the afternoon. Mr.
Thurman spoke with me to-day and wrote you a letter last
night. Try to remember to send Eleanor a card on her
birthday Jan 28th. Thanks!

Keep well, my love, and I'll take care of the
home front. With that same love in my heart and a
kiss from Jimmie, I am
