Last evening I Rec<sup>d</sup>. your Favor of the 5<sup>th</sup> of May  
and you may Rely upon it nothing shall be wanting  
in my Power to forward the new Emission as soon as  
it can be got Ready - which I Expect will be in less  
than a month

we have Reports to day from all Quarters that Charleston  
is taken but no Certainty from any Quarter  
however it seems we have Reason to fear it will be the  
Case soon - we have not yet Rec<sup>d</sup>. any authentic accounts  
of the engagement in the West Indies both sides claiming  
the Victory but we have the most Reason to believe the  
English came off Second best -

the Derangement of our finances and the length of time it  
takes for the new Plan of supplying the army to take Place  
Creates many Difficultys in the Camp and trouble on that account  
in Congress - I am S<sup>r</sup>. with grate respect your most ob<sup>t</sup>.
