Inclosed is a letter from Col. Hunt which was sent ~~by~~ here to be conveyed to you As it was on Public Service I opened it. By the information of Gen^l Belloros, Cap^t Burt, and Other Gentlemen here there is the utmost necessity of a further Supply of Amunition as the people have scarce any themselves and none to be procured here. It was therefore tho't necessary to forward Col. Hunts letter by Express that some Supply may be forwarded as speedily as possible

We are going on with the Court here without Opposition as yet The Sherriff is now gone with a writ of Habeas Corpus to take Smith Out of Jail. what the issue of this will be is uncertain there are various Opinions about it.

We have no further Accounts respecting the Enemy
