My spirits are still high, baby is fine and my love for you keeps growing stronger and stronger as the days pass by.

Your folks are fine and yesterday Pop read your letter to me. He's quite fond of you and at first kidded me and asked if I had a quarrel with you. Then he read your letter and we all beamed, especially Jimmie. To-day was a quiet day but I did get three letters of yours and a schedule. (Wed. Thurs. Fri.) Also a letter from Babe who's having eye trouble again. It's very possible that he may be washed out if the treatments are not successful. I guess he'll be broken hearted. I think we discussed it months ago, remember?

You mentioned that you may see us within a few months.
Wouldn't Gril be the 5th month and the time you're to get
a furlough? I hope it'll be sooner for I would love to
see you, my darling George.

Baby and I are eating very nicely and we're in good
physical condition. Today I had a swell dinner consisting
of far boiled ham steak with orange marmalade, spinach and
baked beans. I gave Jim his first bean and he loved it.
He had a cold fish dinner and once in a while I eat the
Beechnut Food to save \$ work and time and expense. This
month I expect to save some money unless I'm fortunate
enough to get some nice clothes. Shopping is quite a problem
and the styles and materials are getting worse each day.
I did get a st bottle of "Cream of Kentucky" St. Bowden ^(4 yrs. old) whiskey -
a Schenley product, from Charlie today and paid 4.45 for it.
Is that O.K.? Dunny just called to get your new address and
found out how baby, you and myself are feeling.

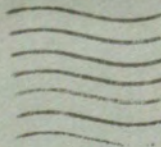
The weather was nice 5 days so baby and I got
