Sr I am this Instant favour with your Letter
of 4th 15 of June. and am very glad to hear there is
some prospect of having that Salem Land settled
I hope you will not let the affair rest till you
have bro't it to a period, you may depend on my
paying my part of all necessary charges that may
arise in accomplish^{ing} it, tho. I am very sorry
you should think it necessary to put me in mind
of it as I think it is apparent enough to every
one that knows any thing of the affair that I
was always as willing & ready to contribute my
Quota as any person concerned in it, and am so
still - Neither have I forgot the Obligation I
am under to you, but shall discharge it soon
to your Satisfaction, I have had no time to think
on this affair as yet, only this that it will be
best to get men appointed to make the Division that
live near the Spot, perhaps something further
may occur soon if it should will advise you of it
The Small pox is only in Two places in this Town
besides the pest house & no prospect of its Spreading
present my Love to your wife & Children
