Cincinnati Sept 4th

Dear Brother

Agreeable to
my promise I hasten
to pen a few lines that
you may know of my
safe arrival at this place
at 10 o'clock this A.M.,
in due time and in good
shape I came all the
way by the Grand Trunk,
instead of taking the Boat,
at Ogdensburg, and arrived
at Toledo O. on Saturday
night 11 o'clock and put
up at the Oliver House
stopping there untill last

night-12. o'clock.

I have reported at H. Q.,
but there are no officers
here that were when I
left the Corps H. Q., being
at Lexington Ky and
the Regt at Nicholasville
but are moving today down
to Crab Orchard so I shall
find them at the same
place. I left there in
furn; I shall leave here
tomorrow morning for
Lexington I spent the
day (yesterday) with Capt
Parke of the 89th N.Y. who
was wounded at Antietam
and was afterwards in
the Hospital with Colo
Titus who was wounded
at the same time

Nothing of note occurred
on the route except I came
near freezing the first
night coming from Reverse
Point to Oglesburg
The Corn and tobacco
crop is nearly ruined
by frost

I will write again
as soon as I join
the Regt. where you will
please direct as soon
as you get this
