getting very drowsy.

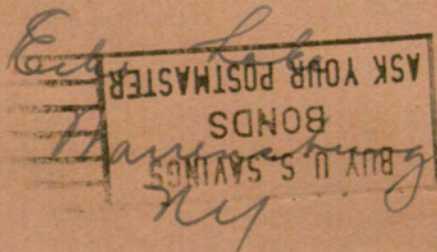
