Everything fine and dandy; but am getting awfully impatient. The days just drag - each one seeming like an eternity.

George, so that we have no arguments when I'm home, please start cursing yourself, that is use up all your "cuss words" now. For, I'm going to want some money. Fran's 21st. birthday is in March, and I want to go "all out" in my present to her.

Perhaps, you don't see it; but I'm in love. George, I'm as sure of this, as I'm definite in my desire to be home. So,

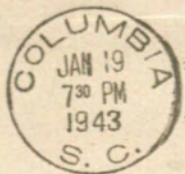
