All is fine at home, both families well and I saw them all to-day. Your mom and Pop came this morning to see us before leaving for Shepherd's unveiling. They look well and were quite excited about a wallet which Pop <sup>✓ Mom</sup> found last night at the concert. It contained \$11.00 personal effects. Naturally, Pop is returning it to the lady who lost it and I contacted her today by phone. All Pop wants out of the reward (if any) is a contribution to a Warsaw Relief Fund. After your folks left, Jim and I had lunch and we both napped. My sister Thelma came during the afternoon and looks very well, sun tanned and seems a little cheerful. She and Maurice had a very wonderful vacation for the past two months and made many friends in Atlantic City and at Lake Erie.

The weather was quite changeable all day long with sun one minute and rain on and off then sun again.







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I took the car out and we drove to my mom's house. Jim had a wonderful afternoon playing with Eleanor's earrings, flower hair ornaments and beads. Helma brought us all some lovely shell earrings and pins which she made while away. Lots and crafts are taught to the men and wives at the Army hotels so Helma took advantage of all this. We left at 6 o'clock and had an early supper and bath which I made this morning. Jim's asleep now and I've just listened to all the latest news announced by Winchell, Keatley and Cecil Brown. It's sure wonderful and this week's events have us all breathless. But I still don't believe Hitler, Goebbels and Goering are dead.

Bob may come in about two weeks for a 6 day leave. From then on, he may have a few more months here and will probably write you all about his plans or shall I say the Army's plans.

Enclosed are some columns which I know you'll enjoy. I did. Hope you're receiving more mail from home and that the camera arrived O.K. Am mailing out another package to morrow containing candy and films. Be careful, darling, and Jim and I will take care of each other.
