the State of Massachusetts Bay and also to make that a part
of the Monies raised by the said State for the United States
to that amount might be retained until the Accounts of the
Expence aforesaid should be prepared and submitted to the
Consideration of Congress. - In Obedience to the said Instructions
they therefore move

That a Warrant issue on the Treasurer of the State of
New Hampshire in favor of said State for three Hundred and
thirty three Thousand Dollars, being part of the Monies raised
by the said State for the use of the United States, and for which
Sum the said State is to be accountable.
