we started again at sunrise &
marched about 6 further. We are
now drawn up in line of battle

Near Wheatland, Loudon Co Vir. Oct 1st 1862

Dear Parents and Sister,

I received your two letters in due season am great obliged for the tea and cloves. I also received a letter from S.M. Taggard, with the stamps. We struck tents at Pleasant Valley Tuesday 1 PM and marched to Sandy Hook thence down the Potomac to Berlin where we crossed the river on a pontoon bridge and entered the Old Dominion again. Marched Tuesday about 10 miles camped in a grove and the next day, Wednesday about 1 PM Started again and traveled about 8 miles further and this morning we started again at sunrise & marched about 6 further. We are now drawn up in line of battle.

The artillery, Parrot guns planted
in front and we have pitched
our tents just back of them.

We have seen no Rebels to fight
against yet they may show themselves
soon or we may attack them or we
may be among the reserves. We are on
on the extreme left of this Corps.

Our whole route from the Potomac has
been on an excellent road, very straight
the ground very hard and free from
dust, leading almost directly south.

We had a severe rain storm with
terrible wind last Sunday & Monday.
The weather has been pretty cold since
the nights quite frosty but I have not
suffered with the cold. I have been &
now are tough and well I think I
have grown a little poorer but shall
have a chance according to present
appearances to recuperate a little on
"Lecith" food & vegetables.
