
Letter from Flow. Meshech Weare to Mesors. Langdon and Exeter, Nov. 17, 1719. 74 Gentlemen, you are very Sensible of the Marning Situation of Our currancy and the great Danger there is that our military Operations which at present are greatly embarrased, will be finally totally totally destroyed through the enormous Demarts which come made for the necessaries of life. Congress have wisely adopted the Method of taxing for supplying the treasury, and thereby take off the necessity of further emissions, which may tend to appreciate the value of our money and bring things to a better regulation. But this measure does not Operate at present, but the most exorbitant demands are Still made for almost every essential article. That a convention of Commissioners " from the States of New Hampthire, majsachusetts, " Rhode Island, Connecticutt, New York, New Sersey, Pensilvania Delaware, Maryland, & Virginia, be requested to meet at Thiladelphia, on the first Wednesday of January next, for the purpose of considering the expediency of limiting the prices of Merchandize, and produce, and if they " Indoge such a measure to be expedient, then to proceed " to limit the prices of such articles as they think " proper in their several States, in such manner as " fhould be best doupted to their respective Situations, in and irrementances and to report their proceedings to their respective legislatures." The General Court here upon Considering said Report, passed the Vote impouring you to appear and det in said Convention, Copy of which I herein inclose I doubt not you will in every thing exert your selves, that may appear likely to remedy our peoplesing Disficultys: And with the Convention may be directed to such measures as may have a tendency to so desirable and End, -I am Gentlemen with much Respect y Hum!
