

Field Hospital 2^d Div. G.A.C.
near Petersburg June 28th 1864

Sir,

Your letter of June 14th making
enquiries concerning Lt. C.W. Wilcox
G.A.C. was received yesterday. In
reply I would say, that I have
personally no knowledge of your
brother's wound, or subsequent
whereabouts. I am detached from
my regt, and had been away
ever since the campaign commenced.
I believe that the general idea
prevails in the regt that he was
made prisoner after being wound-
ed. He did not come to our hos-
pital. His name was reported
by me to Mr. Smith as well
as those of all others injured

whether in response or not.

I wish it were in my power to give you some more satisfactory answer to your interrogatories. You will excuse this brief reply, as my time is very much occupied
