Tuesday 4-4-44

The weather is beginning to warm up and with the rise in temperature my hopes peer about seeing and being with you and Jim soon. It would be a pity to have you come out before this cold weather subsides, but within 2 or 3 weeks it is expected that spring will set in, and then my previous one, you can take the train for Fort Snelling. I knew that having survived the frost 4½ months you will find it most difficult to await the passing of the next few weeks, but I think it absolutely essential that you await better climatic conditions. I am certain you will love this country, and I think you will have a small vacation here.

Your Saturday letter arrived to-day, and I think I wrote about many of the things you discussed. I suppose Jim had one of his off nights, but as long as all turned out well don't worry. I also received mail from Kess & W. Hefman; but don't forget to advise me when you receive the E.H. Co check. You should go to Berea over this coming week-end, as the change will do you lots of good. You will have plenty of time to arrange your trip out here when you return. In the

meantime I am contacting people who can assist us in obtaining quarters while you and Jim are here. As a matter of fact several of the Jewish boys are endeavoring to arrange for a Passover dinner this Friday and Saturday evenings. I am seriously thinking of doing the same just to get acquainted. As yet my Meseric report has not arrived, and as I am anxious to get it, please send another as soon as possible. Also eliminate the name of "Minnicofah" from my address. Please copy address exactly as on envelope.

One of the lieutenants is trying very hard to have me transferred to his Company as he has a job for me that will get a good rating. All indications point to my getting it, but knowing the Army I'll not tell you about it until it happens. Otherwise all is well. I feel fine and lively, visited the dentist this A.M. for a check-up, and completion of the work started in Camp Plouffe, and on Friday I go back again. Merely fillings this time, so don't worry. I just finished Chew, and phoned a Mrs. Brady, who promised to arrange for a Passover dinner for me and another boy on Saturday. Not being so religious(?) I deferred the Seder on Friday but expect some real home hospitality on Saturday. Also will meet some Jews
