to lean on.

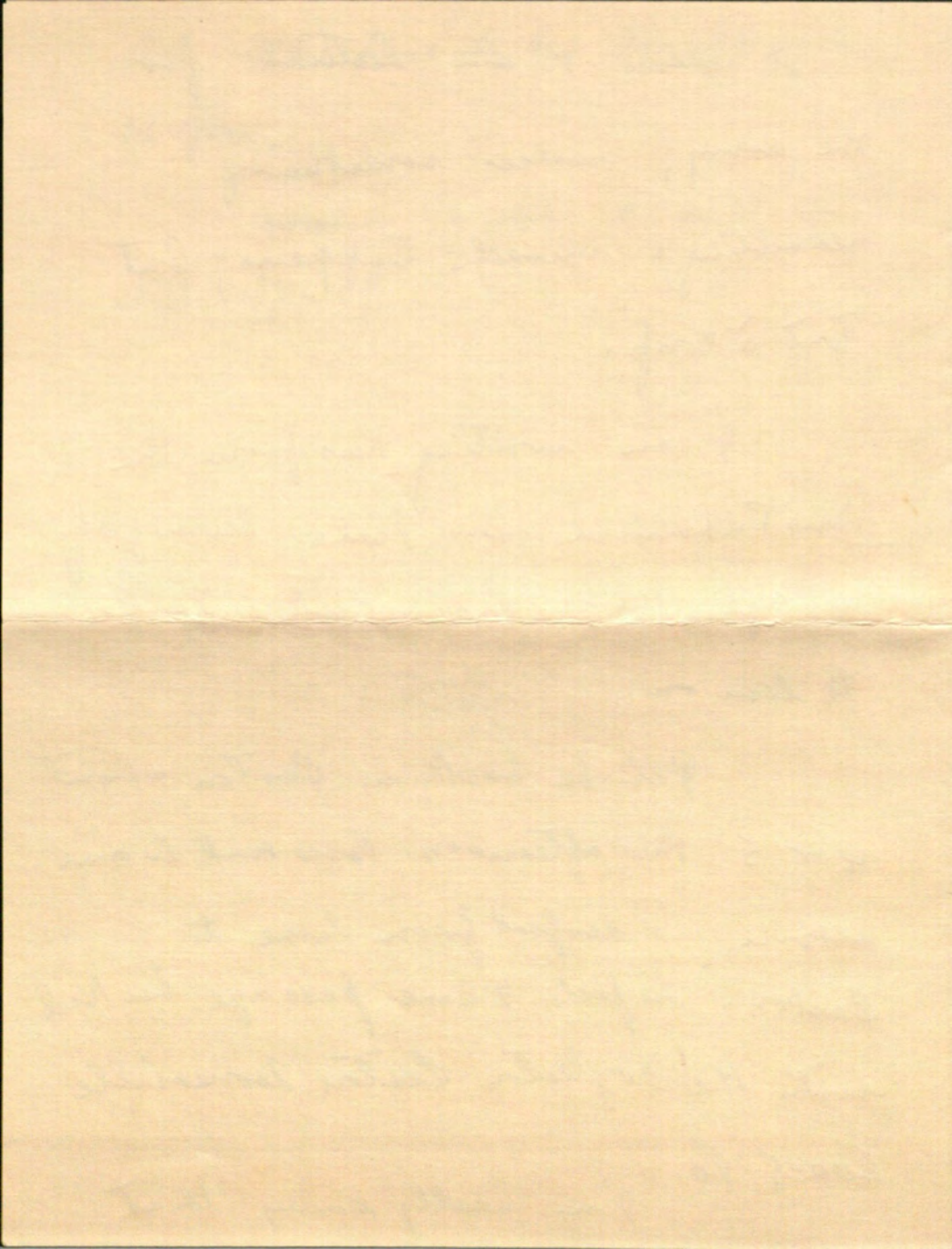
I'll be back in Easton about

With a handshake in mind -

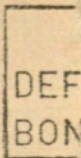
