I could not Exchange any Money in Boston; the Late Act for fixing Paper Money on the Exch. seems to Induce People to hold their Hard Money, in Expectation of the Exchange being higher - I have Brought the Paper Money to this Place, & shall sett off for Camp with it, tomorrow Morning, with Company, where I ^{hope} it will arrive safe - The State of Massachusetts have sent a part of the Sum Voted in Hard Money as a gratuity; the remainder they intend to send as soon as it can be Collected. I have made inquiry here, but see no prospect of Exchanging any - Accounts from Camp are that the Spirit of Mutiny has subsided since the Execution of the two Mutineers of the Jersey Troops. —
