Both our Master of Education (36 credits) and Post-Master's Certification (27 credits) programs start in the summer and can be completed in two years. Many courses are delivered using a hybrid format of in-person and online. For example, summer courses that meet once a week, on Fridays, with additional online assignments. The program also incorporates action research and internships, for applied knowledge and skill development.
