Best regards from Herb & Mildred. The morning started with Sarah coming in at 7.45 and that was some relief as baby was up during the night.

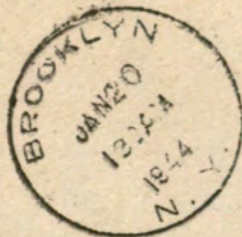

He's quiet at all times but he kept standing at the head of his crib and then wet so up I jumped up, changed him and tucked him in comfortably. Got your ^(Suzanne) Postal to day and also an income tax form for 1943 plus a statement with the balance of 1942. What shall I do with the form and latter?
