to you.

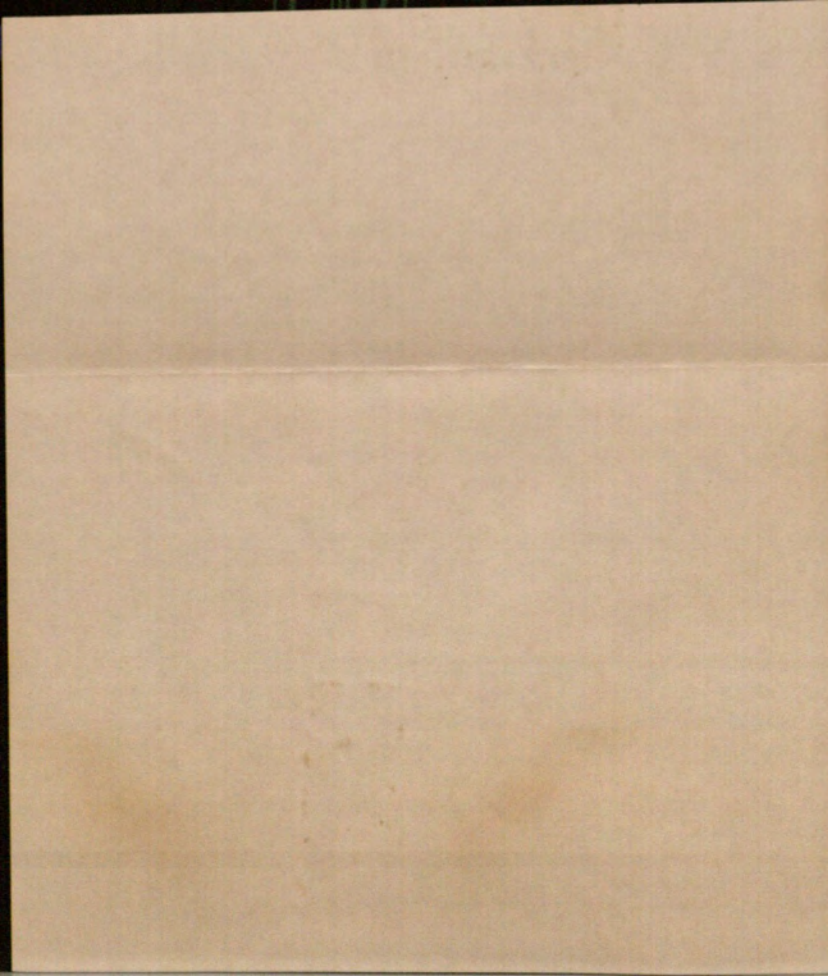
Keep well, darlint and love you as always
