Flower, sweetheart:

I have been counting the hours since you left ever reminding that we were so fortunate to have been together for the past three months. Yours and Jim's presence did so much to brighten up, and revive this military chapter in back of life that I shall ever remember it as the beacon light of this period. Let us hope that soon, oh so soon, it will be possible to keep the light burning brightly with no separations to mar our joy, happiness and love. Yes, my beloved, it is once again a hell, empty would you left me behind, and I look forward impatiently to the time when you, Jim and I will be reunited.

Of course I have received no mail from you yet, but I do hope all went as well as expected during your return trip. Did Jim have fun? How is your cat? Who met the train? Is everything in good order at home? Are my folks, and yours, well? There are many questions I desire an answer to, but I know you will cover the field as

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soon as time permits. Do not attempt to write any lengthy letters for several days, but do drop me a card or short note. If we are still here I may phone you Sunday at about 12 to 1 o'clock, N.Y. time.

No further news re our movement. We were scheduled to leave to-day, but the trip, as I explained in yesterday's letter was postponed. I do not know whether we are scheduled to move soon, or how long we will stay, but if we do I think you will see me. As for well, I feel fine and dandy, but lonesome for you and Jim. That's so busy at the office, and to-night I'm going to a movie on the port.

Received a letter from the Whitmans yesterday, and one from Bob to-day. Practically no news in either letter. Please advise what goes on with the Pincus. Hope Jim's boy arrives in good shape, and advise when received. My best to everyone, a kiss to Jim, and all my love and devotion to a great wife, a sweet girl, and a wonderful sweetheart.
