Board of Har or the Committee of Commerce. The Hould Committee I will easily see the impropriety of Ordering any part of the Cloathing so imported for the Thoops of this State (as this would be partial I as by this Rule our troops might have the whole of the others go without; as blothing have nothing to do, but as agent to receive & deliver the Cargoes, not blothies could Order them out of my hands. Major Suhols arrived at Boston from General Hartungton the Day before I came away to forward on the Cloathing to the army, he also called on me & mentioned the matter & Informed me that he must lay the matter before the General, in case any State interfered in the Clouthing !! desired him not as Iwould lay the matter before the State & doubted not they would retifie it . - your Honors must be sensiable that it must be my Duty to lay this before Congress in case they are sent on for our Troops which

would give me from as it would reflect on the State fof he service to our Troops as they will have their frant of them If they are sent of the State of course the General well Order them as he pleases when he finds they are the Continents I we shall advance that effence for Nothing. am with great Respect Gentlemen Motto Ot Den.
