hew burgh 25 June 15th : (Gircular) On the 11 tof May last longress passed a re-- folve carnestly recommending to the executives of the feveral States, from New Kampshire to penfyl -vanier inclusive, to forward on to such places as the greater mefter forward should direct, at the ex - pence of the respective states in the first instance, all such fupplies of provisions as they have been. called whom to furnish; by the resolution of Congress of the 4th of hovember laft. I hope the feveral legis-- latures have, in confequence, agreed on fuch mea sures as shall render this reccommendation effec - tual, by furnishing the executives with the power and the means of carrying it into execution ... At the time the resolution reached me the bufiness of transportation was in such a train as promised the keeping up a fupply of provi - from till the measures above referred to could be fixed. The time is now arrived when they must take effect, or the army be again subjected to the deftresses which they have already too often experunced. I therefore big leave, in the most in

importunate manner to request an immediate compliance with the above recommendation of Congress . - This request I should sooner have presented, but I was em barrafsed on a comparison of the present with some former resolutions, which at the moment occurred to me, but which I could not then take into confideration, and the refolve having been by accident folded within another paper, where for sometime it lay concealed; Ind! recollecting precesely the terms of the, this application has been unavoidably portponed The former Reso-- lutions particularly referred to are those of the 15 hily A 30 th hovember last, by which the storckeepers in the quarter masters department are made the receivers of provisions including live stock. By these resolutions it is made the duty of the storekeepers to examine all articles received, to note deficiencies, and to reject such as should be deficient in quality. This was practicable when all articles were to be delivered at certain deposita-- ries, but on the states being required to forward to the army all their quotas of provisions, I concurred they would deen it unnecessary at a great expense to col--led them / part perhaps by a retrograde transportation to the posts where the storescepers were stationed and

without it, the inflection required, and confe -quent rejection of bad provisions, could not easily be effected. But if the provesions pass no inspec. - tion in the ftates where raised, and any part should afterwards be rejected on their arrival at the army, a very great expense would be incun - red for nothing, but which the state sending such provision would be unwilling to sustain \_ Other difficulties presented, but it is not necessary to enter into a detail of them. at all events as matters are circumstanced, all the provisions, required by the resolutions of the 4th of Novem? last must be transported to the army by the respect - time States solely, or by furnishing money to the quarter mafters to enable them do it. Should there be a failure, I see no alternative but the starving or disbanding of the army or their supporting themselves by an oppnessive military force. I therefore earnestly intreal the immediate assistance of your state to effect the transportation of provisions agreeably to the inten-- tions of congress in the resolution first above men-- tioned, Should your Excellency think proper to con-

continue the firesent mode of transportation, through the agency of the quarter mafters, they must be furnished with the means of providing teams I drivers with due dis-- patch and of defraying their expenses. - This mode appears to me the least embarrafing as the commels aris will make their applications to the quarter mafters in the usual way - But if any other mode be adopted, the quantities of provisions of the places to which they must be transported, must be determined by the demands which the commessaries shall make, and the configuent transportation take place as if done thro the agency of the quarter mafters.
