The United States in Congress Assembled

June 2^d 1791.

Resolved

That all bills of credit which
issue in pursuance of the act of the 18th of March
1790 in any of the States after the expiration of one
year from the time the interest on such bills begins
to be computed be marked by writing or stamp-
ing before they are issued with the words or cha-
racters Int. p^d ^{or 1} one year. —

That such of the said bills as have already
issued or may issue in the course of a year from
the time interest begins to be computed on them be
when such interest is paid marked in ~~the~~ like
manner to prevent the necessity and expence
of exchanging them. —

That where any State has adopted
similar adequate provisions these shall not
operate. —

That the several States suspend as far as
possible the issuing of such part of their
respective

respective quotas of the said bills as remain
to be paid. —
