Dear Ed

I apologize I'm a no good bum, not having answered your letter and postcard. But it is the gospel truth that I have been as busy as a cockroach. We have started a new section called Personal Affairs and we are just trying to get organized. It comes under A.S.C. Circular 41, so if you have it take a look at it.

As for the news. Beebe is up at Langdon New York taking his boat training and should be there for another 4 weeks, then he gets a leave and then goes back for his assignment. I sure am hoping to get a leave. I leave the folks up to Atlantic City for Easter and stayed with them for the first two days and then came back to work. Mother stayed the whole week and Pop the greater part of the week. It was at least a good rest for the two of them which they certainly could have used. As you probably know Atlantic City is a recreation center for the Army Air Force and also has a large hospital for overseas casualties. So it is not a pleasant sight.

Last Tuesday night was a fellows' meeting and it was turned over to the Fellowship Team for a rehearsal as they want to put the drama on sometime in June.

Whether it was because of the weather or some other reason
about 16 showed up for the rehearsal. Julie Leary wanted
to put something through preventing them from using
our meeting room for rehearsals. At times a little
