January 10, 1944

You certainly wrote a beautiful letter, and I'm not protesting. What with all the letter writing you do have you find the time to write a $4\frac{1}{2}$ page letter and be interesting from beginning to end beats me. I am taking your warning to heart and am taking the greatest pains to write this letter in a legible script. I trust that this one doesn't cause you as much grief as my past letters.

I missed the last meeting, it raining and I didn't feel up to it so stayed home instead but gathered the following dirt. Of the committee appointments Sadie Wathman told me of the following appointments. Billy Rusel was appointed chairman of the Social Welfare committee, Joe Golobanner was appointed together with his son in law (two bad you couldn't have had him as your father in law, your lucky boy). to the social welfare board and Joe was also made Chairman of Entertainment.
