Your letters are always a source of good reading and again you assure me that all is well. The enclosed snapshots were swell to look at and you sure look cute as a mountain climber in that new Chaparral. The alpine native looks great and appears to look like a movie actor. Jim will surely enjoy those European stories his Daddy had to tell on those cold winter evenings, as well as his Mommy. Our reunion isn't too far distant and the summer is going fast. Perhaps there'll be a fall reunion, who knows. Mom and Pop wrote that all is well and that they'd like to come up this week end instead of Labor Day week. I've already answered them and asked them up for Labor Day and this week end.







Now that the wars are over, they know that they should relax and what's better, have country at any time. Try to persuade them to take a week off, I've tried but without success.
