We have not been organized
yet there is so much to do
that is the non commissioned
officers have not been appointed
I have acted as Clerk thus far
and have been writing every
movement Sprague was
detailed the next morning
to work in the Quartermasters
department It is not
certain now when
we shall go but expect when
we do to go to Washington
I never have felt better than
since I have been in camp
life we live well but coarse
I shall have to stop now will write
again soon As ever your affec son
