Pursuant to a warrant from you Directed to the Select men of Hampton falls in the Province aforesaid bearing Date the twenty ninth Day of May 1753 We have made an Assessment Upon the Polls & Estates (Rateable by Law) within said Hampton falls And Committed a List of said Assessment to Benjamin Hilyard Constable of Hampton falls for the year 1753 Requiring him to Collect and pay of said Assessment to the Treasurer of the Province aforesaid for the time being the Sum of Ninety three Pounds New Tenor Bills of Credit on this Government on or before the last day of December next Also Pursuant to Another warrant from you Directed as abovesaid bearing Date the 9th Day of July 1753 We have Required the abovementioned Benjamin Hilyard Constable to Collect and pay to the Treasurer of the Province aforesaid for the time being of the abovementioned Assessment made by Us, the Sum of forty Eight Pounds Seven shillings three Pence New Tenor Bills of Credit or in such Species & at the Prices As mentioned in your warrant, at or before the 25th Day of December next Ensigny - And this we make As Our Return of the Name of the Constable & the Sums he is to pay - Dated at Hampton falls the 18th Day of September Anno Domini 1753 -
