The first week I went home on a 3 day pass and really had a pretty good time even though the weather was bad it was very cold but it rained the entire time I was home but there I go complaining again. But my pants look good all right up again and no cuffs. I don't know how long I will be here but I am hoping to get a discharge not on points because I only have 50. My brother Stanley saw his last unit of training then a furlough and to the Pacific, he saw the opportunity. all well at home and they all send their regards well.
