Danny may see me to-morrow if he's not too busy.

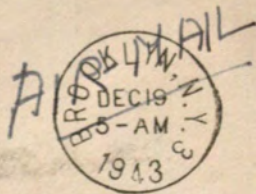
Baby is growing tall, plays peek-a-boo at all hours
