Yesterday Morning we were ordered to march
 we broke camp early & marched about 10 miles

 At our camp at Mill Dale we were on Grants
 right now we are near ^{the center} Ben Logan's

 think Johnson can raise force enough to
 attack us. Bannar has it that we marched
 here as the stores of N. were nearly gone
 there would be a desperate attempt to
 break our lines somewhere. Yesterday
 was a hot day & we sweat like buffaloes
 marching. I slept nicely last night
 The nights are splendid here. The band
 plays nearly every evening. "Funker Doodle
 Marching Along" "We will rally round the
 flag boys" "The girl I left behind me" &c
 when well played these splendid moonlight
 evenings are cheering tunes to go to sleep
 by I learn that the cause of our letters not
 coming are being directed via Cincinnati
 there is no one to look after & send them
 on. But a few days a man was sent back
