

State of New Hampshire In Com<sup>tee</sup> of Safety doct<sup>r</sup> ap<sup>d</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> 1776  
To

In the Hon<sup>d</sup> Continental Congress having requested, that this State compleat their Battallions to their proper complement during the War, ready to take the Field without Delay

In consequence of which the Gen<sup>d</sup> Assembly at their late Session, Voted to raise 600 Men to fill up the three Reg<sup>ts</sup> belonging to this State in the Continental Army, & to proportion them to the several Regiments in the State - you are to raise out of your Regiment

able Bodied Effective Men which you, with the other Field officers, are to proportion to the several Companies in your Regiment according to their Numbers - the men are to be enlisted to serve during the War, & are to receive on raising Muster two

hundred Dollars as a Continental Bounty, & Three hundred Dollars as a State Bounty - & it is earnestly recommended to the several Towns to advance the said Bounties, which will be allowed to them by the State - Every Town has liberty to enlist men in any part of the State, & the men so enlisted will be considered as belonging to the Town by whom the Bounties are advanced - And you are appointed Muster Master, of the Men that shall be raised in your Regiment & to make returns thereof as soon as may be to the Gen<sup>d</sup> Assembly, or in their Receipts to the Com<sup>tee</sup> of Safety
