

Danbury Oct 9th 1778 ⁸ 119

Sir

The Duty I owe my Country & Posterity make it an indispensable part of my conduct to give you the earliest Information of One David Farmworth of Hollis & John Blair of Holderness in the State of New Hampshire who was brought to my Quarters in the Evening of the 7th

On a close Examination I had all the Reason to suspect them to be concerned in a very dangerous Conspiracy against the well being of the United States — Therefore I refer them to the Determination of your

Joint Martial which is now sitting as they are charged with coming under the Denomination of Spies from New York — The Inclosed

Extract from their Examination will I conceive be sufficient to induce you to make such Further Inquiry as your Wisdom may dictate —

I should wish I had it in my Power to have transmitted you a more Particular List but as yet: they appear to be obstinate & nothing they have discovered but what seems to be with the greatest Reluctance

They pay with them from New York 10:007 Dollars in counterfeit Money. They concealed it about two Miles from hence: by

their Information have all the Reason to think there may be large Sums circulating with you — Therefore send you Inclosed a Bill of the

Different Denominations — Should any further Discovery of any consequence be made previous to their Execution (which I trust will take place) you may be assured it shall be forwarded you without loss of Time — I am with Esteem
