Will send you another package etc. I wrote you I wasn't going to mail any more. Hope you get it soon and that letters came through. Tomorrow Velda Bell is visiting us and I'll write you all about it. No calls today but heard from the folks. They're O.K. To-day was the mildest day of 1945 and Jim and I were out in the sunshine all afternoon with our neighbors.
