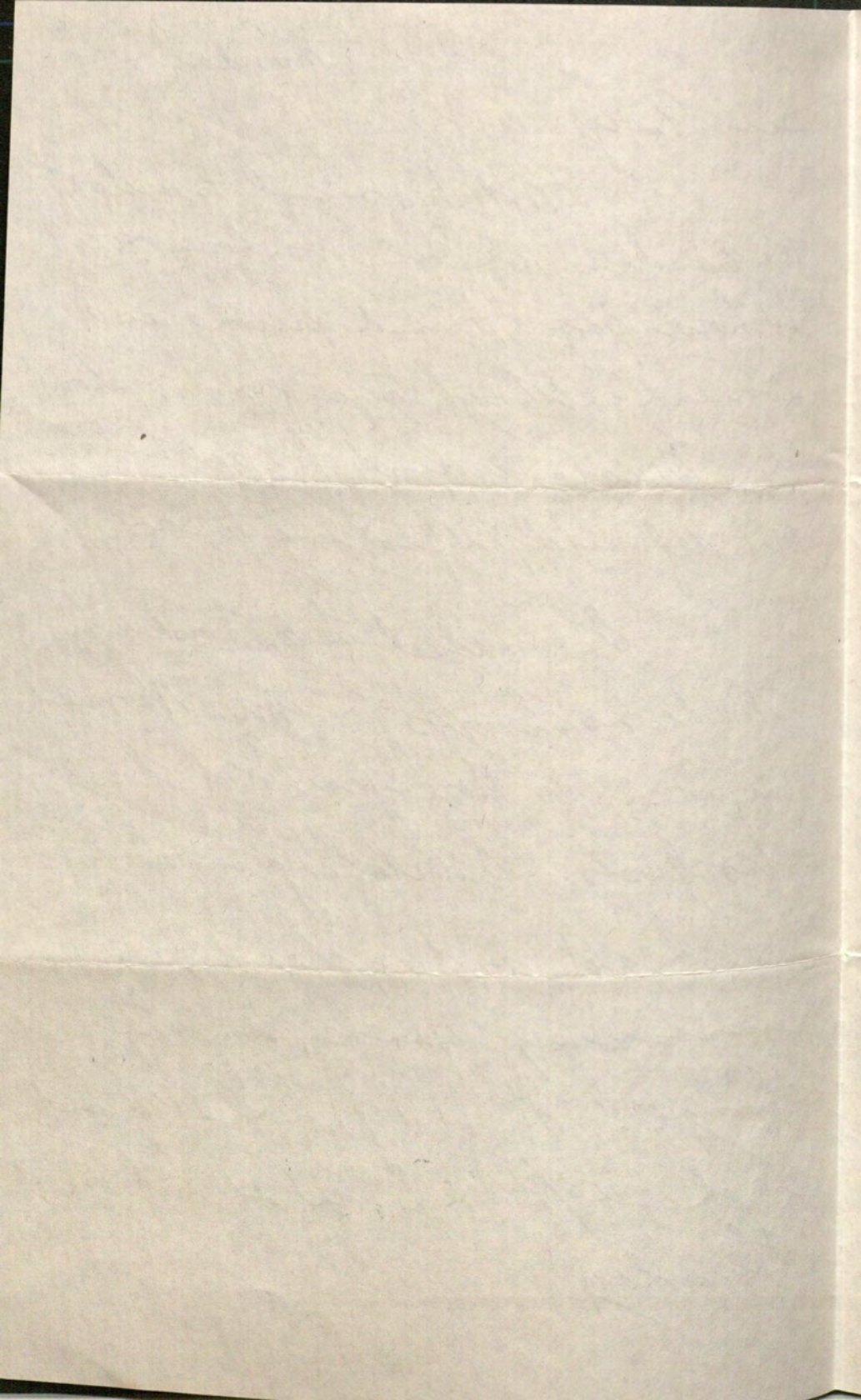


Monday
